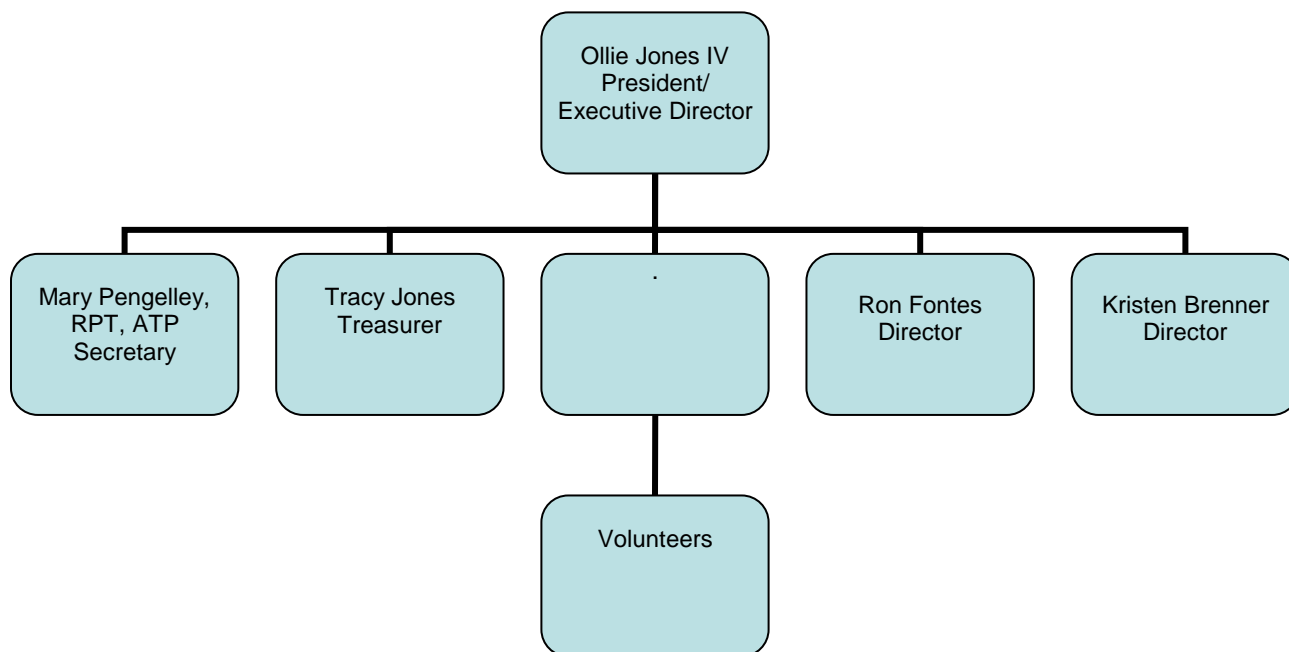


Hope 4 Mobility Board of Directors & Organizational Chart

In 2009, during Janae's second set of orthopedic surgeries to correct her hips, scissoring and tightness in her hamstrings, adductors and heel cords, Ollie felt an overpowering need to become more proactive in her physical development. He decided to utilize his business, engineering and manufacturing skills to design a line of therapy & durable medical equipment (DME) to assist Janae and others with physical and developmental disabilities.

Ollie's continuous research & development into solutions to address the pains and issues that Janae and millions of other children & adults with developmental disabilities & mobility impairments have to endure led him to an amazing new invention. He realized that the solutions to the various conditions and stages required multiple Durable Medical Equipment (DME) which is very expensive and cost prohibitive for most families. This led him to design and develop a 15-in-1, one-size-fits-all, multi-purpose, modular, transformer-style DME & Physical Therapy Device that will significantly reduce the cost and hence the access to many more families who could not

Mary has worked since 1983 with children with a wide variety of acquired, congenital & developmental disabilities and **Special Needs**, including cerebral palsy, traumatic brain injury, genetic disorders, muscular dystrophies, cognitive and developmental delays, brachial plexus injury and torticollis. Mary has worked as a pediatric PT in rural Jamaica as a Peace Corps Volunteer, at Blythedale Children’s Hospital in Valhalla NY, at Easter Seals in WPB, the Paley Limb Lengthening Institute in WPB, the Arc of PBC, and currently works for Progressive Pediatric Therapy Inc., providing in-home therapy services for children of all ages.

Mary was instrumental in developing Potentials Charter School at the Arc, an innovative, therapy-intensive school for children who are non-ambulatory and non-verbal.
